# New meeting in Portugal next week of FOREST-IN Project, on forestry education for small landowners

Is being held at the same time as BIOFORUM, a seminar on forest management

The village of Branca, in the Portuguese municipality of Albergaria-a-Velha, will host next week a new working meeting of the FOREST-IN project, which aims to promote good practices and forestry education among private forest owners, their managers and technicians, and other agents involved in sustainable forest management.

The working meeting, which will be held from 23 to 26 October, will have the participation of Cesefor, as a partner in this project, which has as partners the University of Aveiro (Portugal, coordinator of FOREST-IN), PEFC Spain, FSC International, Unimadeiras (Portugal), the Forestry Association of Galicia (Spain) and the Model Forest Association of Provence (France). Within this framework, Cesefor will report on the progress of the work with which it participates in this European initiative, which is consisting of the development and implementation of computer tools for forest owners.

In addition to the meeting of partners, on Friday 27 will take place an open event, BIOFORUM, on sustainable forest management that will address the challenges and opportunities of this sector in Portugal, at a time when the approach of new proposals and review of traditional practices is on everyone's lips after the tragic fires that this summer have devastated the Portuguese country, claiming almost a hundred lives.

BIOFORUM (www.forest-in.eu/event/bioforum) will not only propose alternatives and future scenarios, but also experiences on research, management, multifunctional uses of forests, use of forest resources, among other aspects. In this framework, the example of the Mycology Programme of Castilla y León (Micocyl) will be presented, in an intervention that will be carried out by the technician of this project in the province of Salamanca.
